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## Expectations off site

Dear Parents/Carers

We have sent the letter below to our Year 13 students; we ask that you take the time to read through and discuss this with them.

Dear Students,

Welcome back to school! We know that the last few months has been tough for some of you and, for others, coming back to school will seem like a daunting prospect. Do remember, we are always here to support you.

Most of you will be in school for lessons only up to October Half Term and possibly beyond so you may be eating lunch at home. If you are hoping to go to Tesco (or the new Morrison's at the bottom of Mortimer Hill) to buy lunch, however, please make sure that you are adhering to all the guidelines regarding social distancing and acting as the young adults you are. We have asked that you use the crossing and don't cut through the houses. There should not be large groups of students going into Tesco at one time - please limit groups to 4 or less at any one time. Be aware that vulnerable people will be using the local shops and we hope that you will always be considerate and do all that you can to keep everyone safe. Where possible please bring food into school to eat.

As we have mentioned before, you should be walking to Tesco rather than taking your cars. It's better for the environment as well as your own health. You are a generation who are particularly aware of climate change so do your bit when you can! We would encourage anyone who is able to walk or cycle to school in general to do that too. We know that's not possible for those of you who live further away, though. If you do have to drive to school, you need to be aware that, with the building work, there is no longer any parking available on site for students. There is plenty of parking around the school but please do also be very mindful of our neighbours and try and park a little further away to give everyone some space. If you are able to be in school for a full day, there is a possibility of a space on site; please speak to Miss Moore if this is the case.

Please remember that you represent the school whenever you are in Sixth Form dress code. You are young adults and you are responsible for yourselves when you are off site so please act accordingly and show our community what fantastic young people you are. We are generally very proud of you all so it is frustrating when we have to

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deal with complaints from local residents about the behaviour of a few, thoughtless students who are letting down their peers. Thank you to the vast majority of you who are an absolute credit to yourselves and the school.

Finally, most of you have been permitted home study when you don't have lessons in school. This means you should be working independently. No students should be meeting socially at this time or be doing anything other than studying whilst at home, with all distractions removed. If you know this will be a challenge for you, then please speak to one of the team to arrange working in school.
